
## FDG Salmon & Sea Trout Fly Tying Course

## **Skara Monger**



Originally for Brown Trout in the Orkneys – adding a tail and changing rib to silver are good for Sea Trout.

## Pattern / Materials

Hook Kamasan B175 #10 or #12
Thread Red Wine / Claret 12/0
Tail Fluoro Orange Cock fibres
Rib Silver Wire Medium

Rear Body Medium Opal Mirage Flat Tinsel

Front Body Claret Seal's Fur
Rear Body Hackle Fluoro Orange Cock
Front Body Hackle Orange dyed Grizzle
Sparkle 2 Strands Flashabou

Shoulder Hackle 1 GP Body feather dyed Orange

Shoulder Hackle 2 GP Body feather natural Red (or dyed Red)
Shoulder Hackle 3 Blue Grizzle Cock (or Blue dyed Guinea Fowl)

Head Black thread & varnish (Optional Black Muddler Head)

## <u>Method</u>

- Mount hook in vice, ensure shank is level.
- 2. Tie on thread 2mm behind eye and lay touching turns down shank to bend, binding in Tail fibres.
- 3. Tie in wire rib under shank and mirage tinsel on top of shank return thread to midpoint of body binding down rib and tinsel waste.
- 4. Tie in Rear body hackle.
- 5. Wind tinsel to midpoint shank, tie in and trim waste. (start as far to rear as practical)
- 6. Wind rear body hackle in open turns back to rear, trap rear with rib and wind up to midpoint shank in about 5 open turns, tie in. (do not trim)
- 7. Dub Seal Fur to front body.
- 8. Tie in front body hackle and wind in open turns back to midpoint, trap with rib and wind rib in open turns to front of body.
- 9. Tie in and wind 2 turns Shoulder Hackle 1
- 10. Tie in 2 strands Flashabou to add sparkle.
- 11. Tie and wind 2 turns Shoulder Hackle 2 and then tie and wind 2 turns Shoulder Hackle 3
- 12. Form neat head, varnish and repeat varnish after 24 hours.

(Optional Black or Claret Deer Hair Muddler Head)

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
